

Ohio Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School 2019 Application Guidance

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

The Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program provides funds for safety projects that encourage or enable children in grades K-8, including those with disabilities, to walk or ride their bikes to school. ODOT's SRTS funds can be used for:

- 1. **Engineering** -- Operational and physical improvements within 2 miles of schools that establish safer and fully accessible crossings, walkways, bike facilities, and trails.
- 2. **Education** -- Teaching children about the broad range of transportation choices, instructing them in bicycling and walking safety skills, and launching driver safety campaigns near schools.
- 3. Encouragement-- Using events and activities to promote walking and bicycling.
- 4. **Enforcement**—Enhancing enforcement of traffic laws and initiating community enforcement such as training for crossing guard programs.
- 5. **Evaluation** -- Monitoring and documenting outcomes and trends through the collection of data, including before and after infrastructure or non-infrastructure countermeasures. This information is critical to the sustainability of the program and required for every project.

**Updated Eligibility for 2019:

Infrastructure applications must be projects identified in a School Travel Plan, an Active Transportation (AT) Plan, or equivalent plan, approved by ODOT. Additionally, if applicable, they require a Letter of Support from relevant MPO/RTPO. Projects must enable students K-8 to safely walk or bike to school. Non-infrastructure applications must be projects recommended in an approved School Travel Plan, only.

Applications **must be discussed with** <u>District SRTS Coordinator</u> **prior to applying.** District SRTS Coordinators can approve AT or equivalent plans for eligibility purposes, help communities review and select their priorities for an application, review cost estimates for accuracy, and provide other direction on the application process.

**Items that may disqualify the application:

- 1. If schools are planning to relocate.
- 2. If applicants have not coordinated with their ODOT District SRTS coordinator prior to submitting application.
- 3. If any information provided within the application is later found to be inaccurate.
- 4. If the proposed countermeasure is not identified as a priority in an updated (within 5 years) School Travel Plan, Active Transportation Plan, or equivalent plan.
- 5. Cost estimate is not accurate or is not separated by associated school.
- 6. Applicant has not used a professional engineer or other appropriate discipline to assist in the development of the required construction cost estimates.
- 7. Applicant does not submit one or more required attachments.

FUNDING

Available Funding:

\$4 Million ODOT can provide up to 100% reimbursement of eligible costs. Up to \$400,000 for infrastructure and up to \$60,000 for Non-Infrastructure

Infrastructure Construction Year:

Fiscal Year 2022 (up to \$2M) and 2023 (Up to \$2M) Applicants are encouraged to begin working on design as soon as possible, designed projects may be constructed sooner if funds are available.

Ineligible Costs

Any action or work acted on prior to FHWA project authorization will make the entire project phase ineligible for compensation.

PROCESS

Electronic applications will be available on January 7, 2019 on the SRTS <u>Apply for Funds Page</u>. Application information and scoring criteria can be found on the following pages of this guidance document. Application deadline is March 4, 2019 (5:00 PM).

June 2019	Applicants notified

Applicants will be invited to give a presentation (online or in-person) on the proposed project and address any comments or concerns identified during the review process. Presentations will be scheduled once applications have all been received.

Once projects are selected, letters will be sent out to all applicants. Announcement notification is expected by June 2019.
